- Commonwealth Environmental Services (CES), LLC “Articles of Organization” were received and filed by the Secretary of State on July 26, 2007, primarily to assist eligible DOE contractor and subcontractor employees in obtaining their EEOICPA compensation and medical benefits.
- Former workers and/or “survivors”, including claimants represented by CES, have encountered lengthy delays and numerous denials of their claims even though work histories and experiences appear to support compensation as a result of exposure to PGDP radioactive and toxic substances.
- The existing DOL EEOICPA claims evaluation process is flawed and has resulted in inconsistent application of claims approvals for the same diagnosed illnesses. In many instances EEOICPA claimants have received compensation for prostate and skin cancer, while other EEOICPA claimants with prostate and skin cancer were inappropriately denied EEOICPA compensation and benefits. A random claim approval pattern appears to have been implemented by DOL resulting in inappropriate claims denials.
